History & Summary Information:

City of Clinton had a Capital Improvement Plan completed in 2006. Speaking with SWODA regarding any grants that would be beneficial to City of Clinton, I was informed we are eligible for a 100% CIP Plan Grant. Timing is excellent, as we continue to face aging infrastructure, potential new development, and water needs.

Two items to consider/approve will help establish our local planning committee to help guide the process with staff and Council

This creates Inventory Analysis, Strategy and Implementation programs recommendations. A great guide for current and future Council's to reference as well as new staff and administrators, building capital budgets in the future.

Recommendation:

Staff strongly recommends creating and updating a new CIP. We also recommend our newly created Economic Development Committee to become our Local Planning Activities Committee.

Whereas, Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Public Law 93-383, as amended, authorized by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, as representative of the United States of America, to grant to the State of Oklahoma funds and administrative responsibility for the "Capital Improvement Planning Community Development Block Grant" program; and

Whereas, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, pursuant to designation by the Governor as the administrating agency of the Community Development Block Grant Program for Capital Improvement Planning in Oklahoma, is directed to further the purposes of community development in the State, and is authorized and empowered to accept funds from the Federal Government or its agencies and to enter into such contracts and agreements are necessary to carry out the functions of the Department; and

Whereas, the City of Clinton is a local unit of general purpose government that will provide opportunity for input by residents, is determining and prioritizing community development needs through its written Citizen Participation Plan; and

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City of Clinton that it desires to obtain assistance in community development and hereby requests the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to provide assistance under the policies, regulations and procedures applicable to local communities in Oklahoma,

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City of Clinton that it affirms its commitment to take all action within its power to facilitate the receipt of the assistance of community development funds, and upon receipt, to administer said grant by the rules and regulations established by the United States of America, the State of Oklahoma, and all empowered agencies thereof.
