Minutes of the regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Clinton, Oklahoma, Custer County, held in the City Council Room, City Hall on Tuesday, April 2, 2013 at 5:30 p.m. A notice of this meeting with agenda was posted on the bulletin board in the lobby of Clinton City Hall on Friday, March 29, 2013.

The City received 2 bids for a refueler, Mayor Adams opened the bids and they are as follows:

1. American Refueler bid a 2002 International Truck \$ 89,960.00
2. Omega Aviation Services Inc. bid 2 different refuelers
 - (a) 1995 Trail Master \$ 49,880 adding new hoses \$ 2,400, total bid \$ 52,280
 - (b) 1998 International \$ 54,200 adding new hoses \$ 2,500, total bid \$ 57,200

Councilman Rodolph said he would like to refer these bids to staff, Councilman Hulin agreed.

City Manager Steve Hewitt said he believed it was not until June, but he would verify that with the City Clerk. Councilman Rodolph said that most municipal elections were being held today.

E. CONSIDER SPECIAL EVENTS PERMIT REQUEST PERMIT FROM CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION AND LUCKY STAR CASINO.

Randy Meacham spoke on behalf of the Alumni Association, he requested that Frisco Avenue from the Frisco Center to 10th Street be blocked off to include the alleys, He said he has spoken with ODOT to request that part of Hiway 183 be rerouted and that was granted. Meacham said that there will be entertainment all afternoon and into the evening until around 10:00P.M. He would like to use various city vacant lots and parking areas for the people who attend. He was also requesting along with a representative of the Lucky Star Casino a food and beverage permit; this would allow the Casino to recoup some of the money they are out for sponsoring the main attraction which is the group The Temptations. Meacham also said that this celebration would be in conjunction with the Chamber's Route 66 Festival. City Manager Steve Hewitt proposed not closing Hiway 183 and put up a 4 way stop just as we did for the Route 66 Festival. Councilman Rodolph said we should grant them what they have asked for to include the closing of Hiway 183 and reroute the traffic.
